The NH01 is the first external 2.5in drive with USB 3 we've seen, and thanks to the connection's increased power delivery, it sports just one SuperSpeed mini-USB 3 connector, as well as the corresponding USB 3 cable. Inside is a Samsung SpinPoint M7E 640GB 2.5in hard disk, spinning at 5,400rpm, with an 8MB cache. There's also a USB 3 to SATA 3Gbps bridge chip. Performance is good for a 2.5in external drive, with a read speed over USB 3 of 86MB/sec and a write speed of 77MB/sec. In comparison, over USB 2, the drive delivered a read speed of 33MB/sec and a write speed of 29MB/sec. As

well as nippy performance, the NH01 represents decent value for money, considering that the hard disk costs £60 on its own. If you're looking to carry around 640GB of files, the NH01 is a superb choice, combining a quality hard disk with the speed benefits of USB 3. **hb**

## YUWAA GO 4GB FLASH DRIVE

At £14, the YuuWaa Go 4GB seems expensive, but it does much more than just store files. As well as the USB flash drive, you also receive 20GB of online storage too (50GB with the 8GB version), accessed via a simple browser interface. Not only can it back up files from your PC and the USB stick, but it also allows you to share files with anyone via a web link. The online storage doesn't last forever though – it offers only a six-month subscription with the initial purchase, with a further year available for £13, and 50GB costing a little over £30. This isn't bad value for money compared with other online file-syncing services such as Dropbox, which can cost £80 a year for the same amount of storage, although YuuWaa isn't as easy to use. **nl**

## LE WHIF BREATHABLE CHOCOLATE

We were intrigued by Le Whif's promise of breathable food, and had hoped for high-tech, vaporised, flavoured nano-particles in an inhaler. However, what we actually received was a hot chocolate sachet in a tube. Each Le Whif is a plastic sliding tube that, once pulled apart, allows the powder inside to be breathed in, becoming a flavoured paste when it hits your mouth. Sadly, the idea falls at the first hurdle, since the taste is on a par with the cheapest of cheap chocolate. It's easy to breathe in the powder too deeply as well, resulting in an embarrassing coughing fit and a vague aftertaste of mint chocolate. While each tube contains just one calorie and no added sugar – making it perfect perhaps for weight-obsessed models who want to remember what food tastes like – everyone else will want to stick with eating the usual way. **hb**
